Complete all of the following requirements in order to accurately develop and propose a WPA project for your local area. All aspects will be graded with rubrics of various point values. See the teacher if you have any additional questions. A sample rubric is attached for student reference. Actual rubric point values may vary.

WPA Poster:

- **Poster must be in color and be 11x17 or larger paper**
- **Poster must show:**
 - **Illustration/image of project**
 - **Name of project**
 - **What project is**
 - **Date of project**
 - **Slogan for project**

Letter to Editor:

- **State what project is**
- **Provide details/demographics of project**
- **Convince public to support project**
- **Positive outcomes of project**
- **One negative consequence of project**
- **How project will benefit community**

PowerPoint/Video:

- **State what project is**
- **Provide details/demographics of project**
- **Convince public to support project**
- **Positive outcomes of project**
- **One negative consequence of project**
- **How project will benefit community**
- **Copy of blueprints**
- **Images of construction of project**

Blueprints:

- **11x17 or larger blueprint sheet of project with**
 - **Location**
 - **Compass**
 - **Measurements**
 - **Material list with prices (use modern numbers)**
 - **Drawing of project**

Building Plan:

- **Typed, 1.5 spacing 12-point font standard margin 1.5–3 page paper detailing:**
 - **Type of project**
 - **Significance of project**
 - **Consequences/outcomes of project**
 - **Estimated time of completion**
 - **Projected costs of project**

Model:

- **3D model made of any material (Popsicle sticks, building blocks, etc.)**
- **Must have labels for major parts of project (windows, structures, etc.)**

Timeline:

- **Visual color timeline of project**
- **Timeline consists of at least fifteen milestones of project**
- **Eight milestones of project must have picture**
